**Coal** (mainly destined for utilities or export) was the top originated rail commodity for U.S. railroads in 2009, followed by **farm products** (mostly grain); **chemicals**; **nonmetallic minerals** (mainly crushed stone and gravel, phosphate rock, and sand); **intermodal**; **food products**; **metallic ores** (mostly iron ore); **waste and scrap materials**, **petroleum and coal products** (including liquefied petroleum gases, coke, lubricating oils, and asphalt); **primary metal products** (mostly iron and steel); **pulp and paper**; and **lumber and wood products**.
